GWI insists that all programmes for action must recognise and make provision for the vulnerability of girls and women, who account for two-thirds of the 756 million illiterate people in the world. Teachers for Rural Futures represents a significant opportunity to address multifaceted challenges in rural communities, driven by a lack of quality education and gender stereotypes. The girls are funded to complete the three-year course and, once finished, will return to their rural community to teach there. They are also supported through mentoring and holistic skill building to prepare them for work as a secondary school teacher in a rural area.
