Twitter is one of the ten most visited sites on the internet.

- a) Go to www.twitter.com in your browser
- b) In the "Sign up" box, enter your full name, email address and password
- c) In the next screen you will confirm your password and username.
- d) Now you are signed up. You need to "follow" 5 people in order to receive your information stream.
- e) For example, type IFUW into the search box. Click the "Follow" button beside the IFUW logo. Immediately you will see the latest message or "tweet" from IFUW. To follow other IFUW members, search for WGU1915, b1614, ShirleyRandell, lindamacnst and MumfordKathy to name the few that we have spotted.
- f) To find people with similar interests to yours, you can search for a topic by preceding it with a hashtags, for example #humanrights #girlseducation #humantrafficking. The search results will show you the people "tweeting" on that topic and you can then "follow" them.

g) You can find people by searching for a username, known as a "handle". A "handle" is always preceded by @, for example IFUW's username is IFUWomen and our handle is @IFUWomen. h) Once you get tweeting, do tweet us at @IFUWomen. We'd love to connect and share information.

Girls, mathematics and perpetual disadvantage in the NZFGW July news letter

The question of gender difference in mathematics, achievement, and attitudes is of continuing concern. It is also intimately linked to the underrepresentation of women in the highest levels of science, technology, math and engineering.

Of special interest to our Mexico and Nigeria members: Universal Periodic Review

In October 2013, the United Nations Human Rights Council will present its evaluation of the state of human rights in Mexico and Nigeria. This human rights evaluation will examine whether Mexico and Nigeria's governments have fulfilled the commitments they made to women's rights and education during the last review (2009).

From 2-4 September, there will be a "pre-session" where IFUW can speak on behalf of our members and can advocate for women's rights to diplomats. This is an important opportunity for you to impact discussions in your country. If you wish to have a voice in this human rights process, <u>please inform us as soon as possible</u> as NGOs are heard on a first come first served basis. Museums of Women

IFUW Board Member Head of Mexico Museum of Women

In the decade for Human Rights education called by the UN, the Mexican Federation of University Women (FEMU) presented the project for the creation of the Women's Museum in Mexico. The Women's Museum has the aim of reviewing Mexico's history with a gender approach, from the pre-Hispanic era to the present time, in order to make women's historic tasks and contributions to our nation visible, and women's history in Mexico ceases to be forgotten. The Museum was inaugurated on March 8th, 2011, on the International Women's Day and is located in 17 Bolivia Street, in Mexico City's historic centre.

The building once belonged to the ancient University Press, founded in 1937 under Luis Chico Goerne's rectorship of the National Autonomous University of Mexico.

For musical learners and achievers

Having performed and presented music by women for the last 25 years and created the information site <u>Women of Note</u>, Diana Ambache has set up the <u>Ambache Charitable Trust</u>, dedicated to raising the profile of music by women composers. She plans to assist women composers both past and present. Often women composers quite well-known in their day were written out of musical history. Getting their music heard again and telling their stories will help create a greater recognition and affection. The Trust will make grants (up to £40,000 a year) to projects which champion and visibly promote music by women.

 Call for nominations for UNESCO/Emir Jaber al-Ahmad al-Jaber al-Sabah Prize to promote quality education for persons with intellectual disabilities: closing date 13 September 2013

Every two years, the Prize is awarded to two individuals, organisations, or centres that have contributed to the promotion of inclusive quality education for persons with intellectual disabilities. The Prize consists of a certificate and a monetary stipend of US\$ 20,000 to each recipient.
