#### **University Women Europe (UWE) Conference 2014**



Over 70 members gathered for the UWE Conference 2014 on 4-7 September 2014 in Bucharest, Romania. The conference theme was "Quality Education for All in Europe" and aimed to create a UWE vision of the demands for high quality education in the 21st century and widen knowledge on the legal, political and administrative procedures of the European institutions. Amongst a number of high level speakers, Mrs. Monica Macovei, Member of the European Parliament (MEP), opened the conference with insights on the future of education in Europe. IFUW's President, Catherine Bell, began proceedings on 6 September, with a presentation on the future of IFUW and the opportunities to work together in Europe on the empowerment of girls and women through secondary, tertiary and continuing education. Caroline Staffell, International Development Manager, IFUW, led a workshop on building membership, with the active participation of members who identified strategies to attract new members and build engagement. Following the UWE Annual General Meeting, Edith Lommerse, President, is now joined by Isabelle Trimaille (France) and Elena Flavia Castagnino (Italy) as the new Vice Presidents. IFUW was

pleased to have the opportunity to interact with members from across Europe and see their enthusiasm to collaborate in Europe and beyond.

#### **USA**

Women Graduates USA (WG-USA) will host its Annual General Meeting (AGM) in Salt Lake City, Utah, on 12 – 14 September 2014. The theme for this year's meeting is "Reach out and CONNECT". It will focus on connecting with IFUW, individual members, trailblazing individuals and organisations and important advocacy issues. The 2014 AGM will emphasise the international aspect of WG-USA and will stress the role of the individual as an advocate for certain policy changes at the national and international level, and incubate possibilities for local and state activities related to these programme priorities. #### Canada

The Canadian Federation of University Women (CFUW) has written to the Canadian Minister of Justice and Attorney General of Canada to call for a public inquiry into the deaths and disappearances of Aboriginal women and girls in Canada. CFUW urged the Minister to implement an action plan to confront the gender-based, racial violence against the patterns of 1,200 missing and murdered aboriginal women over the past three decades. #### **International Literacy Day 2014**

8 September 2014 marked International Literacy Day, an annual UNESCO event aimed at raising awareness for the global literacy shortfall. The theme of this year's Day was "Literacy and Sustainable Development", which focussed on the role of literacy in empowering people so that they can make the right decisions in the areas of economic growth, social development and environmental integration. ### **Proposals & Workshops**

The Elsevier Foundation Awards for Early Career Women Scientists in the Developing World were launched in 2012 by The Elsevier Foundation, The World Academy of Science (TWAS) and the Organisation for Women in Science for the Developing World (OWSD) to celebrate the achievements of women scientists in the early stages of their careers, with the aim of creating role models for other women to follow- a step which is critical for retaining top talent and building a stronger research culture in developing countries. Five Awards are given annually, one each to a female scientist from one of five regions. This year's five awards are in physics and mathematics. Nominations are invited from senior academics, including OWSD members, TWAS Fellows, International Centre for Theoretical Physics (ICTP) visiting scientists and staff, national science academies, national research councils and heads of departments/universities both in developing and developed countries. Deadline for nominations: 17 October 2014.
