# **International Federation of University Women news**

### IFUW urges concerted action on International Day of the Girl Child

IFUW marked the occasion of <u>International Day of the Girl Child</u> by issuing a <u>press release</u> urging local, national and international policy makers to prioritise the situation of the girl child and legislate to protect against harmful practices including female genital mutilation (FGM) and child marriage. The statistics reveal the deeply concerning number of victims where – of the girls and women alive today – 250 million girls were married before the age of 15, while 125 million have been subjected to FGM. #### Strong turnout at IFUW and AGFDU film screening

IFUW, in partnership with Association genevoise de femmes diplômées des universités (AGFDU), hosted a public screening of "Peace Unveiled" from the series "Women, War & Peace" at the University of Geneva on 9 October 2014. After the film, panellists discussed the different issues raised, including the role of women in peace negotiations. In terms of progress made in Afghanistan – the setting of the film – Second Secretary of the Permanent Mission of Afghanistan to the United Nations Mr. Jawad Raha highlighted that the country is the only Islamic state to have ratified the Convention for the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW) without any reservations. Other positive developments in Afghanistan include the jump in life expectancy of both men and women. Despite significant signs of progress, certain barriers for equality still remain, where, for example, only approximately 2% of the police force are women. IFUW and AGFDU will host a second film, "Pray the Devil Back to Hell" in French at the University of Geneva (Uni-Mail) on 16 October 2014, which will also be followed by a panel discussion. #### Canada

### #BringBackOurGirls: Global Week of Action

14 October 2014 marks six months since the abduction of 276 schoolgirls in Chibok, Nigeria, by the militant Islamist group Boko Haram. While 57 of the girls managed to escape the extremists, some 219 still remain in captivity. On 11 – 18 October, numerous voices from all over the world will unite in efforts for a global week of action "to demand renewed actions for the immediate and safe release of the girls". #### **Nobel Peace Prize 2014**

IFUW strongly commends Malala Yousafzai and Kailash Satyarthi, this year's <u>winners</u> of the Nobel Peace Prize. The momentous occasion pays due recognition to the remarkable advocacy efforts in the field of education and children's rights championed by both individuals, despite the numerous threats and challenges they have faced. Ms. Yousafzai is particularly iconic for IFUW's mission given her inspirational stand for the education of girls in Pakistan, enduring extreme adversity and personal sacrifice in the process. IFUW's President Catherine Bell congratulated Ms. Yousafzai by way of letter, describing her as "a role model for all girls". Her resilience is proof that the universal right to education applies to all people, of all nations. States must ensure that all students – *especially* vulnerable girls – are protected from violence, extremism and harassment. It is essential that they are provided with a secure learning environment and safe passage to and from school.
