### **HISTORY**

The Fund was established in 1936 as the IFUW Emergency Fund (later called the Relief Fund) to help University women who had been deprived of the right to work, and in many cases, the right to live in their native countries.

In honour of the many years of long-term Convener Mme Blanche Hegg Hoffet of Switzerland, who was particularly responsible for raising money and distributing assistance during and after the Second World War, the Fund adopted her name in 1968.

### **National Federations and Affiliations news**

#### India

On 8 March, University Women's Association of Calcutta, part of the Indian Federation of University Women's Associations (IFUWA), celebrated International Women's Day by honouring two luminaries in its organisation who have spent their lives uplifting women and girls through education. Professor Chitra Ghosh initiated the India Award (read Update 4 July) for women's empowerment projects and contributed USD 1000 in seed money towards the award. She also established the Green Leaves School as part of the Women's Voluntary Services for girls' primary education. Mrs Barnali Brahmochary established 29 primary and secondary schools for underprivileged students with the cooperation of the beneficiary communities. In addition, she has opened health camps, care for challenged children and counselling centres. IFUWA salutes these two great ladies and wishes them many years of continued advocacy for girls' education.

#### **New Zealand**

The Otago branch of the New Zealand Federation of Graduate Women (NZFGW) hosted a breakfast for International Women's Day. Speaker Tangiway Rewi traced her life journey as a Maori (indigenous) woman entering academia and studying the pedagogy of Maori and indigenous women. Women's roles as mother and grandmother, and the ways in which they participate in their communities and display a work ethic, can be very influential in the education of girls. Members from other local non-profit organisations attended and in this way the focus on education for women and girls, both formal and informal, was spread through a wider network.
