Looking for volunteer teachers

Regular Update readers will remember that IFUW's Sheila Buemi Moore trekked to the top of Mount Kilimanjaro in March for International Women's Day. Sheila also visited schools in Tanzania and Kenya as part of her advocacy work. Give a Heart to Africa is a non-profit organisation which works to empower women through education and skills building in Tanzania, where only 5 per cent of girls finish secondary school.
