Commission on the Status of Women (CSW58)

A delegation of about 20 IFUW members will attend CSW in New York to bear witness to the lack of universal secondary, tertiary and continuing education for girls. IFUW asks the Commission to support greater access to secondary school for girls, in particular disadvantaged and marginalised girls. Child marriage will be one of the topics under discussion at the next Human Rights Council (HRC25) in March 2014 in Geneva. IFUW will attend the HRC25 and is currently preparing a written statement pursuant to the <u>policy resolution</u> against child marriage, voted by IFUW members at our last <u>General Assembly</u>.
