Education for All Global Monitoring Report

The 11th Education for All Global Monitoring Report reveals that a global learning crisis is costing governments US\$129 billion a year. Insufficient funding means that ten per cent of global spending on

primary education is being lost on poor quality education that is failing to ensure that children learn. This situation leaves one in four young people in poor countries unable to read a single sentence. The report finds that good teachers are essential for improvement and calls on governments to provide the best in the profession to those who need them most. Read more

The International Labour Organisation (ILO) will offer a course on Gender and Organisational Change in Turin, Italy from 31 March to 4 April 2014.
