The president of the Finnish Federation of University Women (FFUW), Helena Ranta, wrote an article in Helsingin Sanomat, Finland's largest newspaper, on 6 February. The article calls for zero tolerance to female genital mutilation (FGM) and for active monitoring to ensure that girls living in Finland are not taken to other countries to be sexually mutilated. Germany

Based on the letter template sent by IFUW to advocate that Syrian Women be included at the Syria peace talks, the <u>German Federation of Graduate Women</u> (DAB) sent a letter entitled "Peace Negotiations without Syrian Women?" to the German Foreign Minister and the Federal Minister of Women's Affairs on 10 December 2013. This letter was also sent to the National Council of German Women's Organisations (Deutscher Frauenrat), which sent the letter to its 10,000 members in a newsletter and which published the letter on its website.

Scotland

The Scottish Federation of University Women (SFUW) will hold a seminar in March at the Scottish Parliament entitled "The Scottish Referendum on Independence, particularly with reference to women". SFUW will also hold an annual Research Presentations Day when postgraduate students in the local universities give an account of their work to members.
