IFUW attends Japanese Association of University Women (JAUW) Annual General Meeting On 18 May, Caroline Staffell, IFUW's International Development Manager, attended JAUW's Annual General Meeting on behalf of IFUW President, Catherine Bell, and associated events in Tokyo, Japan. JAUW's President Dr Sachiko Abe led the proceedings, which included updates on JAUW's reformed structure and reports from 21 of JAUW's branches across Japan. Recent branch activities include a lecture series on men's involvement in gender equality, presentation training for scholarship applicants, and drives to engage young members and university lecturers. Members at the meeting made a generous donation in memory of the late Fumi Takano, and to the Turkish Association of University Women (TUKD) to provide support to the education of girls who are severely affected by the mining disaster in Soma, Turkey, last month. JAUW's General Meeting was a wonderful opportunity to meet JAUW members, to hear about JAUW and branch activities across the country, to give an update from IFUW and to meet JAUW Board Members. JAUW's new President, Mrs Kurumi Nakamura, was announced along with the new members of JAUW's Board. Caroline received a warm welcome from JAUW members and was delighted to see the strength of an active association looking to the future.
