International Day of Zero Tolerance to Female Genital Mutilation

IFUW UN Geneva Representative Helen Lom participated in the marking of International Day of Zero Tolerance for Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) on 6 February at the United Nations office at Geneva (UNOG) in Switzerland. FGM "reflects deep-rooted inequality between the sexes, and constitutes an extreme form of discrimination against women." Over 80 participants attended the meeting (international organisations [IOs], non-governmental organisations [NGOs], state representatives and expert panelists). Important issues were discussed by the multi-stakeholder panel, including the role of education in helping to empower girls to resist the practice, by integrating awareness raising about FGM in schools and in medical and paramedical curricula. It was highlighted that men need to be engaged and educated about why FGM is and should be unacceptable. All panelists and participants seemed in agreement against any justification or allowance of the medicalisation of FGM, a more controversial issue in some circles. FGM is not only a health issue but also a human rights issue, which breaches the rights of the girl child and

constitutes a form of gender-based discrimination and violence. About 20 African countries today criminalise FGM. The harmful practice is often associated with early, forced or child marriage and therefore both issues should be addressed together in policy initiatives and legal commitments, at the local, national and international level.
