GWI President at United Nations General Assembly, New York

GWI President Catherine Bell participated in the side event hosted by the Brookings Institution at the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA), 27 September 2015. Together with a group of experts brought together by the Collaborative for Harnessing Ambition and Resources for Girls' Education (CHARGE), Catherine spoke on the panel discussion about the programmatic models that are most successful in cultivating leadership in girls' education. The 17 new Sustainable Development Goals, or Global Goals as they are also known, were adopted by member states at this 70th annual meeting of the United Nations General Assembly.

Women Graduates USA Annual General Meeting, Baltimore

WG-USA members and their guests attended the three-day <u>WG-USA</u> Annual General Meeting in Baltimore, MD, the weekend of September 25-27, 2015. The theme was awareness and action in a global society and sessions ranged from participating in a town hall-style visioning session to listening to information speakers on WG-USA's programme and advocacy priorities: human trafficking; safe access to education for women; women, peace and security. Graduate Women International President Catherine Bell participated actively; it was also the occasion to discuss mutual GWI and WG-USA opportunities and interests.

GWI called for governments to enable teachers to fulfil their vital role on World Teachers' Day

GWI called upon states and policy makers worldwide to celebrate World Teachers' Day on 5 October 2015 and honour the specific objective under Goal 4 of the Sustainable Development Goals, adopted at the UN General Assembly in September 2015, to 'substantially increase the supply of qualified teachers, including through international cooperation for teacher training in developing countries'. World Teachers' Day highlights the fact that teachers must be empowered as a critical step towards quality education, the cornerstone of nations' economic and social capacity. GWI emphasises that teachers remain a key influence in the advancement of girls and women through education; it is essential that the international community and governments stand united to support teachers and quality learning worldwide.
