

#### Teachers for Rural Futures: Benadet's Story Part Two

After weeks of unsuccessfully searching for financial help to go to university, Benadet suddenly had a stroke of luck. Through the local District Education Officer, who knew she had the academic ability to pursue a university degree, she was contacted by the Ugandan Association of University Women (UAWA). They informed her of the sponsorship possibilities offered by GWI's project <u>Teachers for Rural Futures</u>. Excitedly, Benadet completed the application form and sent it off...would she be able to fulfil her dream of becoming a secondary school teacher? Find out what happens next week!

#### Cochabamba, Bolivia Meeting of University Women

Violence against Women and Adolescents in Latin America, particularly in Bolivia, has increased despite the adoption of new, stricter legal standards. The Regional University Women's group (AMPU) met in the city of Cochabamba, Bolivia in September 2015 and reached a number of conclusions and made recommendations on this issue. The Association calls for greater commitment by states to recognise violence against women as a

violation of human rights and for many actors, especially women's civil society groups, to take an uncompromising position to demand prompt, timely and impartial justice.

GWI has become a member of the <u>Girls Not Brides</u> global partnership of more than 500 organisations committed to <u>ending child marriage and enabling girls</u> to fulfil their potential. The longer a girl stays in school, the less likely she is to be married before 18 and to have children during her teenage years, with all the benefits of improved earning capacity and better health for them and their families. Partnership between GWI and Girls Not Brides means strengthening mutual advocacy initiatives on empowerment through education up to the highest levels and <u>eliminating child marriage</u>.
