### Women Graduates-USA sets organisational goals for the path forward

As part of an ongoing organisational capacity assessment review, Women Graduates-USA (WG-USA) benefited by having external and internal professional reviews generated by member input to help set future direction. Following this input, <u>WG-USA</u> came up with the five following goals: 1) To have a positive impact on the economic, social and political issues affecting women and girls, globally; 2) To attract a membership of US-based graduate women interested in making a social impact; 3) To be the leading organisation providing Education and Advocacy and Leadership Training for women in a global society; 4) To build partnerships with civil society organisations and multi-lateral institutions particularly the United Nations; 5) To become a leading member of <u>Graduate Women International</u> and create meaningful partnerships with its international affiliates. GWI applauds the revitalising efforts of <u>WG-USA</u> and wishes them all success in realising their goals.

The Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) has released a new report on the numbers and proportion of women in parliaments worldwide. The IPU was established in 1889 and is the international organisation of Parliaments. The Union is the focal point for world-wide parliamentary dialogue and works for peace, international co-operation and representative democracy. It contributes to the defence and promotion of human rights, and works to co-ordinate the exchange of experience among parliaments and parliamentarians of all countries as well as intergovernmental and non-governmental organisations which are motivated by the same ideals. The term of 11 Committee for the Elimination of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW) members will be expiring in December 2016. The <u>CEDAW Convention</u> is the only UN human rights treaty that focuses on gender issues. In this regard, it is important that the twenty-three experts of the CEDAW Committee have an understanding of the realities of women's lives and have competence in the field of women's human rights. NGOs can help by identifying women and feminist experts with a strong understanding and experience of promoting and protecting women's rights and who are willing and able to be Committee members.
