GWI member Japanese Association of University Women assists Nepal after earthquake

On 29 April 2015, a massive earthquake with a magnitude of 7.8 on the Richter scale hit Nepal, followed by another on 5 May 2015. 14 districts of Nepal were badly affected including Kathmandu, the capital city. The earthquake claimed more than 8,500 lives, demolished many ancient world heritage sites and thousands of civilian homes. Nearly 800,000 people lacked basic services and many were left with nothing. The <u>Japanese Association of University Women</u> (JAUW) distributed educational materials to school children and blankets to families in Kavre, one of the the worst affected areas. The Nepal Association of University Women (NAUW) extends its gratitude to JAUW for their generous donation to the victims of the earthquake.

Graduate Women International (GWI) partner Girls Not Brides releases new resources explaining child marriage

Whether child marriage causes school dropout or vice versa is not always straightforward, but what is clear is that child marriage very frequently undermines investments in education by hindering girls' ability to

attend school, acquire new skills and knowledge, and put existing ones to use. The reduced educational attainment related to child marriage has significant economic impacts, not only for girls on an individual level, but also on a national scale. Developed by GWI partner <u>Girls Not Brides</u>, this <u>brief</u> explains how to incorporate and measure child marriage prevention and response in the education sector.
