Call for women's meaningful participation in the peace process in the Arab Region

The League of Arab States has presented a <u>Regional Action Plan for Women, Peace and Security</u> as part of the United Nation's review of <u>Security Council resolution 1325</u>. The Action Plan calls for meaningful participation of women and girls at all levels of decision-making to build and preserve peace in conflict areas and to combat terrorism. Afflicted by armed conflicts and an alarming surge in terrorist extremism in several countries, the Arab region has seen some of the worst forms of sexual and gender-based violence

during conflict, from the abduction and sexual enslavement of young girls under the Islamic State, to early and forced marriages as a result of displacement. GWI advocates for the empowerment of women in the peace process as integral to maintaining stability and peace.
