GWI delivers oral statement at the 34th session of the Human Rights Council

On 10 March, GWI Executive Director Stacy Dry Lara delivered Graduate Women International's (GWI's) oral statement at the 34th session of the Human Rights Council. The statement highlighted the indispensable role of education in contributing to building a culture of peace. GWI emphasised that the human right to education enables many other rights; it enables girls and women to develop the necessary skills and competencies needed for peacebuilding efforts. GWI made numerous recommendations in its statement. In particular, GWI urged all stakeholders to promote and facilitate equal opportunities for women in leadership, peacekeeping and decision making. GWI at the 61st session of the Commission on the Status of Women

The sixty-first session of the Commission on the Status of Women, now in its second and final week, is being held at the United Nations in New York. Thirty-four GWI members are participating in CSW, as well as hosting parallel events throughout the session. On the morning of 15 March, the Australian Federation of Graduate Women (AFGW) hosted a parallel event on Health, Education, Sport, and Women's Empowerment: Narratives from Australia, Rwanda, and Bangladesh with Professor Dr Shirley Randell and Professor Dr Jaya Earnest. Alongside Mosqoy and the Young Women's Christian Association (YWCA), the Canadian Federation of University Women (CFUW) co-sponsored a parallel event on Mentorship in the Changing World of Work on 16 March. GWI members Jeanne Sarson and Linda MacDonald co-hosted a parallel event with five organisations on Using Law to Empower Women and Girls to Live Free from Violence in Work and Family. On 18 March, Women Graduates-USA (WG-USA) sponsored a parallel event on the Challenges to the Economic Empowerment of Refugee and Migrant Women.
