#### Germany & Russia to present reports to Committee on Rights of the Child

The 65th Committee on the Rights of the Child is underway in Geneva. The Committee monitors the implementation of the <u>Convention on the Rights of the Child</u> (CRC) which is an agreement between states to protect the best interests of children. Its provisions include the right to freedom from violence,

trafficking and exploitation, the right to free compulsive primary education and the right to equal treatment regardless of gender or background. Read whether your country has fulfilled its agreements to protect and promote the girl child in education. Every national affiliate can take action - please contact IFUW if your national affiliate wishes to advocate for girls in your country.

# **Advocacy**

#### **Back to Beijing: Beijing+20**

In 1995, the <u>Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action</u> made clear that the human rights of women and of the girl child were an inalienable, integral and indivisible part of all human rights and fundamental freedoms. Women's empowerment and their full and equal participation in all spheres of society are essential for the achievement of equality, development and peace. It was also clear that equal access to and equal treatment of women, girls, men and boys in education and health care are critical to women's equality. Women and girls must be free to develop their potential to the fullest.

Ahead of the 20th anniversary of the Beijing Declaration, the United Nations Economic and Social Council called (read <u>resolution</u>) on all states to review their progress in implementing the <u>Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action</u>. The resolution strongly encourages civil society to participate in government consultations. The deadline for states to complete these reviews is 1 May 2014. Please contact your government or the <u>IFUW office</u> to get involved. Final outcomes will be presented at the 59th session of the Commission on the Status of Women in 2015. Read the <u>guidance note</u> from UN Women.
