International Federation of University Women news

Join us in Mexico City on 19 September 2014, when IFUW and the Mexican Federation of University Women (FEMU) will hold a seminar on "Quality Education: Transforming the Lives of Girls & Women in Latin America". The region has seen substantial progress in education over recent decades, reaching a net enrolment rate of 95% in primary school and 77% in secondary school. While research also shows a favourable trend in female education, there are still several gender equality issues which act as barriers of access to education for girls and women in Latin America. Outdated teaching curricula and education practices affect the quality of education available in schools and universities, while cultural prejudices and socio-economic considerations also hinder vulnerable girls and women in their ability to access learning. The seminar aims to address these barriers with a view to identifying solutions and best practices going forward. For further information please visit IFUW's seminar page.

New Zealand

The New Zealand Federation of Graduate Women (NZFGW) will host its 30th conference in Wellington, New Zealand, on 26 - 28 September. The theme of the conference will be "Women Empowering Women as Leaders" and will include a panel discussion on the topic with women representatives from business, local government and international organisations. The event will also host several different workshops including: "the value of CEDAW and the Beijing Platform for Action" and "Financial Literacy". IFUW in partnership with Association Genevoise de Femmes Diplômées des Universités (AGFDU) will host an open film screening of "Women, War & Peace" at the University of Geneva (Uni-Mail) on 9 and 16 October 2014. The film series from the creators Peace is Loud follows the resilience and courage of women in different conflict zones, including the fight for women's rights in post-Taliban Afghanistan ("Peace Unveiled") and the bravery of the Liberian women who took on the warlords and regime of dictator Charles Taylor. Child, Early and Forced Marriage Worldwide, including the Elaboration of the Post-2015 Development Agenda

In its resolution 68/148, the United Nations General Assembly decided to convene a panel discussion on child, early and forced marriage worldwide, including the elaboration of the post-2015 development agenda. The <u>panel discussion</u> on 5 September 2014, will build on the report of the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) on preventing and eliminating child, early and forced marriage. The report was prepared pursuant to the UN Human Rights Council's resolution 24/23, and the related summary report of the panel discussion convened by the Council on 23 June 2014 during its twenty-sixth session.
