Graduate Women International Members in New Zealand and Sierra Leone launch Twinning Project

Graduate Women International's (GWI) Twinning Programme offers NFAs and branches the opportunity to engage in a partnership with a fellow NFA or NFA branch to achieve common goals. To empower girls and women through lifelong education, many people need to work together; twinning is one of GWI's programmes designed to facilitate such partnerships. The Otago branch of the New Zealand Federation of Graduate Women (NZFGW) and the Sierra Leone Association of University Women (SLAUW) are working together on a twinning project that supports girls in Sierra Leone to stay in and complete secondary school, and exchange with girls in secondary school in New Zealand. Linda Williams SLAUW Coordinator for International Relations commented, "I am optimistic that this will be the start of a long lasting relationship which will be very rewarding on both sides."

Advocacy

Geneva, Switzerland, 11 October 2015 - Today, International Day of the Girl Child, Graduate Women International (GWI) calls for states and policy makers worldwide to take action on the challenges affecting girls

and empower them to fulfil their potential by removing barriers to their education at all levels. Despite the existence of legislation to protect and promote girls including Convention on the Rights of the Child, the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW) and the Convention on Consent to Marriage, Minimum Age for Marriage and Registration of Marriage, these measures do not go far enough. GWI strongly emphasises the critical timing of action following recent adoption of the post 15 Global Goals to ensure that the measures agreed will be implemented before momentum is lost.
