Graduate Women International and Teachers for Rural Futures: Benadet's Story Part Three

After submitting her application form for sponsorship for teacher-training at Uganda's Makerere University, Benadet waited patiently. In July 2015, she was contacted by the Uganda Association of University Women (UAUW) with the good news that she was a successful applicant. Benadet and her family were thrilled! She is now studying to be a teacher of science at Makerere University and, when she graduates, she will be able to return to inspire girls in her rural community as a financially independent, university-educated woman who is also breaking traditional stereotypes. Benadet says: "I am so proud to study a Bachelor's degree at Makerere University. Because of your sponsorship, I am also working towards being a role model in my teaching career."

Our project will support 50 young women from rural Uganda to become qualified secondary school teachers and ambassadors for girls' education. The British Association of Women Graduates and the Hegg-Hoffet Fund assist two Iraqi sisters

The Hegg-Hoffet Fund for Displaced Women Graduates has been able to help two Iraqi sisters now living in the UK. Though they have different degrees they decided, after some considerable discussion and advice from members of the British Federation of Women Graduates, to take the same course to enable them to find employment, which had proved difficult. They are taking a Royal Society of Arts course in English Medical Terminology so that they can work in the health service as translators. This will assist their integration into their new country and help others in their community. For a successful application a woman must have a first degree, have the right to remain in the new country and be taking a short course to enable her to use her qualification or learn a necessary language. <u>Violence against Women Centres</u>, established this year in the Punjab, have achieved further success on their ongoing campaign to reduce impunity for violence against women. Following their advocacy drive, the Punjab education authorities took a landmark step in this sector to include education on this issue in the curriculum. The timing of the initiative coincided with the global <u>16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence Campaign</u>.
