While significant progress has been made in gender parity in primary and secondary education enrolment in Rwanda, barriers to achieving gender equality remain. Care releases new report on child marriage - 'Vows of Poverty'

For millions of girls in the developing world, access to education is limited or eliminated by conflict, poverty and by social norms. Parents with meagre means often face impossible decisions about their daughters'

lives, leading too often to marriage because they cannot feed or clothe them. With no income and little opportunity to earn it, even girls themselves sometimes choose early marriage in the hope of escaping poverty's relentless grip. Underlying all barriers, however, exists one persistent, destructive theme: the devaluation of girls. GWI is addressing child marriage and other barriers to girls' education with two initiatives: Teachers for Rural Futures in Uganda, and in Rwanda a partnership with Orange Device Group. The report by Care, the international nongovernmental organisation (NGO), contains new data on the countries where the rates of child marriage are higher than girls' secondary enrolment.
