Graduate Women International launches the Winifred Cullis Fellowship Fundraiser in support of women's doctoral education!

Geneva, Switzerland, 27 October 2021 - Graduate Women International (GWI) is proud to announce the launch of the 2022 Winifred Cullis Fellowship in honour of the legacy of GWI's first international president, Winifred Cullis. A fundraising campaign for the fellowship is taking place from 16-31 October 2021 to support women in higher academia.

Cullis was a lifelong feminist. She received a university education at a time when few women did. Her values were as a feminist and intellectual with great personal integrity and loyalty. She co-founded the British Federation of University Women and International Federation of University Women, now GWI. She was the second woman in Britain to be made a professor, and the first to achieve this position in a medical school.

"A doctorate degree signifies the highest level of academic achievement, and the title is powerful in today's world where education funding and progress, especially for women, have been severely set back by the COVID-19 pandemic", said Stacy Dry Lara, GWI Executive Director. "The GWI 2022 Winifred Cullis Fellowship will empower a woman to reach her full potential and contribute to society and future generations", she adds.
