GWI Statement to the Human Rights Council 49th session calls for increased education infrastructure

Recalling its 45th Human Rights Council (HRC45) written statement (August 2020) in which GWI stressed that the COVID-19 compulsory social distancing was creating more dependency on technology and digital platforms. GWI repeats that increased dependence on digital technology and hybrid learning affects women and girls predominantly, putting them at higher risk of dropping out, of losing their fundamental human right to education and of jeopardising their present and future academic and professional opportunities.

GWI stresses the need for governments to replicate noteworthy, good practices and ensure that elearning will not broaden existing digital inequalities and urges them to participate in reducing such imbalances by ensuring equal access to digital tools and skills. To this end, and as the demand for digital skills grows exponentially, governments must put into place infrastructure for training across all sectors and all levels of education. Hence, GWI insists on the crucial importance of SDG17 on the power of partnerships: governments must partner with telecom industries to develop development plans.
