Irene Kafui Vorsah Amponsah, Ghana

Irene Kafui Vorsah Amponsah (PhD), from the **Ghana Association of University Women (GAUW)** is a Lecturer, Data Analyst and the former Department Registration and Examination Officer of the Statistics Department of the School of Physical Sciences in the College of Agriculture and Natural Sciences, University of Cape Coast-Ghana. Her area of specialization is Computational Statistics. She has over 20 publications to her credit in areas of statistics, mathematics, STEM and gender. She is currently the president of Women in Statistics Ghana and a member of Ghana Statistical Association, Caucus for Women in Statistics, Graduate Women International and many others. Dr. Kafui is a peer educator, and mentor. She is an active member of GWI Young Members Network and has been trained as a United Nations Sustainable Development Goal Ambassador by GWI.

Hazel Bowen, South Africa

Hazel has been a member of **South African Association of Women Graduates (SAAWG)** for many years, holding office as Branch President (Cape Town) and National President on a number of occasions. She has arranged several national conferences and initiated several projects (some of them funded by Project 5-0 and Bina Roy). She administered SAAWG bursaries for many years and was on the Editorial Board for the SAAWG Journal also for some years. Her GWI/IFUW activities include being convener of both the Resolutions and Membership Committees and she was Vice-President: Education and Advocacy on the 2016-2019 GWI Board of Officers. She has the distinction of being Honorary Life Member of SAAWG.

Hazel studied Politics, History and Industrial Psychology and is an English teacher (for second language and foreign students). She also has diplomas in Business Management and Human Resource Management, and Certificates in Adult Learning in the Workplace, Conflict Resolution, Mediation and Computer applications. Besides being involved in various non-profit organisations she was instrumental in developing a non-profit training centre for which she received acknowledgement as "Woman of Enterprise" and was featured in the Women's Directory from 1994 to 1997. She then went on to set up and run her own training centre, preparing (mainly) women for the world of work, and providing office administration skills.

Yasemin Dönmez, Turkey

Yasemin Dönmez has been a member of the **Türk Universiteli Kadinlar Dernegi (TUKD)** since 1982 and, and she has served for 20 years as an active manager. She established the Istanbul Kadıköy branch in 2006. She is the founding president of the branch, and she has been the branch president for many years. She has managed many projects about women. She participated in the General Assemblies of the UWE- European University Women and IFUW International Federation of University Women.

In 2013, she took part in the Local Arrangement Committee at the General Assembly of the IFUW Conference in Istanbul, hosted by Turkey, and carried out sponsorship relations. They carry out the Strong Woman, Happy Woman project, which is the most important work of the Kadıköy branch, together with the municipality, which is the local government, and they provided training to adult women. They also did a presentation about how to implement the project to the participants as a workshop in 2019 GWI Centenary conference Geneva.

She is an architect and has a Master's degree. She worked as a control engineer in the Ministry of National Defense Construction Department for 20 years. She participated in the meetings of the Ministry of National Defense throughout Turkey, representing the institution. She is currently retired. She continues to work on women, their rights, and the education of female university students. She is married and has a daughter.

Karoline Dorsch-Häsler, Switzerland

Karoline was born in Switzerland, and she has been a member of the **Swiss Association of University Women (SVA)** for about 25 years. She was first Treasurer of the Zürich Branch, since 2014 she has been President and since 2020 Co-President of the Zürich Branch. She was CIR SVA for five years. Since 2019 she has been GWI Assistant Treasurer Switzerland. She is a member of the Organisational Development Steering Committee.

She received a Master's degree in microbiology form the University of Bern, Switzerland and a PhD in Microbiology from St. Louis University, St. Louis, MO, USA. For a long time, she performed research at the University, first in the USA, then Switzerland. From 1992 until her retirement, she was Executive Secretary of the Swiss Federal Committee for Biosafety. She has two sons and two granddaughters.
