## GWI announces General Assembly Keynote Speaker Dr. Helen Bond, Ph.D.

GWI is excited to announce that the keynote speaker on day 1 of the General Assembly will be Dr. Helen Bond, Ph.D. Dr. Bond is an Associate Professor in the Department of Curriculum and Instruction at Howard University in Washington D.C. With a Ph.D. in Human Development, Dr. Bond was recognised for her work with equity and technology integration. She has expertise in teacher education, prevention of violent extremism through education (PVE-E), international affairs, and human rights. Dr. Bond has been a liaison to the Center for African Studies and the Center for Women, Gender and Global Leadership. Dr. Bond is also a Fulbright-Nehru Scholar to India, as well as Co-Chair to the Sustainable Development Solutions Network. She served as an expert with the United Nations Development Program (UNDP) and the Ministries of Education in Ethiopia, developing a capacity study for a teacher licensing system for Ethiopia. Dr. Bond was inducted in the 2020 Alumni Hall of Fame by the Ohio State University-Mansfield for her work in diversity, equity, justice and education. **GWI thanks Dr. Bond in advance for sharing her knowledge and expertise at the General Assembly!**
