
## 16 days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence begins Friday, 25 November!

# IFUWA Swayamsiddha Project

IFUWA Pune in collaboration with Kaveri college, undertook a 10-month National Project on' Stress and Resilience Building of Gradate Women during Pandemic Times'. Members and non-members participated in completing a standardized questionnaire which was statistically analysed. The results showed areas where women of different ages and socio-economic backgrounds need skills development training to combat and cope with continuing Pandemic situation stress



factors. The Project was spearheaded by Malati Kalmadi and her team members which was named as Swayamsiddha meaning becoming self-reliant. On completion of the project, certificates of appreciation were awarded to students, teachers and the Principal of Kaveri College on 17<sup>th</sup> October at University Women's Association (UWA) Pune by Dr. Ranjana Banerjee, IFUWA President for their valuable technical support on the virtual platform for 10 months which enabled a large number of member participation for the Swayamsiddha webinar series. UWA of Pune President Neelam Jagdale facilitated for Dr. Ranjana Banerjee and Dr. Ashok Agrawal, Principal Kaveri College. ## **GWI submits United Nations 2023 ECOSOC Partnership Forum Consultation**

Question: Please, share one policy recommendation to enhance partnerships and stakeholder engagement to accelerate the implementation of the SDGs from now until 2030.

GWI Answer: Graduate Women International's research on SDG implementation in 51 countries shows that the localization of SDGs is key to their accomplishment. Our recommendation is that United Nations agencies, nationally designated SDG agencies, and multilateral funders significantly expand their partnerships with, and funding for, local NGOs, women's professional organizations, youth associations, and beneficiaries' networks.

Question: Please share an example of a game-changer action and/or innovative multi-stakeholder partnership that is making an impact on SDGs implementation on the ground and that could be featured at the 2023 ECOSOC Partnership Forum?

GWI Answer: Graduate Women International is training, organizing, and deploying its members in 45 countries to build capacity into UN and other agencies that will bridge gaps in SDG implementation identified by UN agencies. GWI's Renew and Rebuild Train-the-Trainer Platform will train its member organizations to exponentially increase their work in their constituent communities around the world as well as enhance their project and financial accountability to partners and funders

Question: What is your main message to world leaders and other stakeholders on strengthening partnerships and stakeholder engagement for SDG implementation, in the lead up to the SDG Summit (September 2023)?

GWI Answer: Based on purposeful research about a country's' specific needs and in partnership with NGOs best prepared to collaborate with governments, enable local NGOs to become the catalysts for scalable change in their communities for the successful implementation of the SDGs.

## GWI UNESCO Representative participates in 215th session of the Executive Board

On 7 October, GWI UNESCO Representative, Elaine Didier, participated in the 215<sup>th</sup> session of the UNESCO Executive Board. Objectives include strengthening relationships between UNESCO and its partners from the civilian society (NGOs, foundations). Decisions: Admission of AIH (International association of hydrogeologists), Association status and candidature: Haiti; Admission and/or renewal of five NGOs and one foundation, renewal of two foundations, updating of the NGO partner list (65 in association status + 346 in consultation status), Liaison Committee Activity report (2021-2022) presented by Davide GROSSO (CL President). The report reminds 3 main objectives: Promoting youth involvement, promoting diversity, improving dialog with the National Commissions. To read the full report, click HERE.
