Canadian Federation of University Women (CFUW) E-Club hosts Human Trafficking for Sexual Exploitation Conversation

On 17 November, Canadian Association of University Women (CFUW) E-Club and the University Women's Club of Vancouver held a webinar on human trafficking for sexual exploitation. Speakers included renowned former inner high school teacher, advocate and author, Ms. Cathy Peters, who has given over 650 presentations on human trafficking for sexual exploitation to more than 20,000 people, and award-winning Canadian country music artist and founder of Not in My City, Paul Brandt. Not in My City is a non-governmental organisation that aims to end sexual exploitation. Also presenting was Janine Benedet, lawyer and professor at University of British Columbia Peter A. delivered a presentation at the Building Information Modelling (BIM) Coordinators Summit 2023 in Dublin, Ireland. The BIM celebrates excellence and digital innovation in Architecture, Engineering, and Construction. The event hosted 235+BIM expert speakers from 45+ countries. Wagdy virtually presented at Stage NetZero, a presentation titled, 7-11 for Better Sustainability. The focus of her

presentation was the direct impact of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) on the architectural and construction fields, highlighting strategies to mitigate environmental challenges in project development. "Being a youth and future developer of YMN, one of the organisers of the 2021 GWI Organisational Development (OD) group and YMN SDG Ambassador, gave me a better understanding of the SDGs goals and put on my shoulder the responsibility to work and encourage others.
