The 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence is an annual international campaign starting on 25 November, International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, and ending on 10 December, International Human Rights Day. It highlights the pervasive violation of women's rights globally, inspired by the tragic anti-feminist massacre at École Polytechnique University Montreal on 6 December 1989, symbolic of broader societal violence against women and girls.






This is the kick off of the GWI 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence poster campaign.




