## Difference between UN CSW and CSW Forum

## What is the UN Commission on the Status of Women (UN CSW)?

The UN CSW is the principal global intergovernmental body dedicated to the promotion of gender equality and the empowerment of women. This is the government side of the annual session. Side events must be sponsored by a Member State and are held inside the UN campus.

#### What is the CSW Forum?

The NGO CSW Forum is a civil society gathering that runs parallel to the UN Commission on the Status of Women (CSW). It provides civil society the opportunity to engage with the CSW processes and sessions without any special qualifications (such as ECOSOC-accreditation). Parallel Events are produced under the CSW Forum and held outside the UN campus.

## **CSW68 Priority and Review Themes**

The **CSW68** and **CSW68 Forum** take place **virtually and in person** at, or in the facility of, the United Nations headquarters in New York City from **11-22 March 2024**.

- •Priority theme: Accelerating the achievement of gender equality and the empowerment of all women and girls by addressing poverty and strengthening institutions and financing with a gender perspective.
- •Review theme: Social protection systems, access to public services and sustainable infrastructure for gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls (agreed conclusions of the sixty-third session).



- 2. Graduate Women International (GWI) advocates for universal access to quality education and lifelong learning.
- 3. GWI urges states to prioritize education financing as a means to eradicate poverty and narrow the gender gap.
- 4. Strengthening institutions is crucial alongside education to ensure sustainable progress.
- 5. Gender-responsive financing is essential to dismantle systemic biases and promote gender equality in education.
