

Educating Outside the Classroom: Women's Museums Empowering **Girls and Women**















Developed by GWI VP Education, Shirley Gillett, and GWI Education Committee Chair Lucia Guzman, with support from the Education Committee. The parallel event treated the subject of relatively recently established specific women's museums or a women's section of a current museum. Such institutions are a public good, and funding them is vital in educating and empowering girls and women and achieving gender equality. In the event, GWI explored examples of how museums, as a living embodiment of history and culture, are valuable in deconstructing the status and position of women and should be accessed by all women and girls, no matter their socioeconomic status.

Speakers identify effective policies for the inclusion of women, particularly the unbanked women and diversity, as critical steps to redress these exclusionary, gender-biased differentiating practices and predatory individuals. The event showcased knowledge expert speakers Hana Brixi (World Bank) and Monique Newlak (International Monetary Fund).


